Contrast between Leonard, Story was clear at forum

Thank you for the informative candidate forum the Courier sponsored on Sept. 27.

I was surprised to see more similarities among the county commission candidates than between the House District 25 candidates. Tammy Story must have thought she was running for the school board, as that was all she chose to talk about. I recall that the Jeffco school board recall effort was all about out-of-state teacher unions overturning our local board while pretending to be a grassroots effort. I was equally surprised that Story did not distance herself from that bamboozling of our residents but instead calculated that there was power in victory.

Most evident of the contrast between the two candidates was their answer to "What criteria would you use to determine your support or opposition to proposed legislation in the House chamber?"
